Michelle introduced the speaker, Bill Hutton. Bill graduated from Hammond High School and grew up in the neighborhood in which he still resides. He will talk about Hutton and Hutton, a family tradition. He began his speech talking about his daughter, Carrie, who started in engineering and then went into actuarial science, an easier subject for her.

Eleven percent of family owned businesses survive to the second generation. Forty-seven survive from the second to third generation, and 89% survive from the third to fourth generation, which is where Hutton and Hutton is now.

In the mid 1800's Richard and his brother came to New York. In the late 1850's Richard found Margaret in Canada. On June 21, 1861, his great-grandfather was born. He graduated with architectural and engineering degrees and moved to Rochester, Michigan City, South Bend, and in 1885 moved to Hammond.

Family members designed some of the courthouses in Hammond. The original Hammond High School was designed in 1916 by Bill Hutton's great-grandfather, Joseph. He was a 33rd degree Mason. He designed the original Masonic Temple that was recently demolished in Hammond. He was considered the dean of Lake County architecture. He left the firm to his son, William, also a Hammond High graduate.

Bill's grandfather married in 1915 another Hammond High graduate. He had four children. He was noted for designing the original

Edison, original Morton, and T.F. North. In 1940 in Plainfield, IN he was commissioned to design cottages for troubled youth. He locked his keys in the car. Students were able to open the door.

The third generation of the Hutton family is Robert Emil, Bill's father. He went to Washington Jr. High and graduated in 1940 from Hammond High School. He went to IIT and received a degree in structural engineering. He married and had six children. Bill is the only one that went into architecture and engineering.

His Uncle Chuck is also third generation. He was very intelligent, worked in the family firm for two years, worked at Purdue Calumet as a full professor, worked on wind tunnels and designed and built a hot air balloon.

In 1975 he took a sabbatical to sail around the world. He took a couple of students with him. In February 1976 he was washed overboard off the coast of San Juan. He was never found. There is a scholarship at PUC in his memory.

Bill Hutton thinks his uncle is on an island doing what he wants to do. Two students that were with him claimed he went under and never came back.

Fourth generation Hutton family is the speaker, Bill Hutton. He went to the old Kenwood School. Purdue rejected his application and he went to Ball State. He has had a great deal of experience in health care work. He coached soccer at Hammond High. He has two children, Carrie and Justin,

Fifth generation, Carrie, is a teacher at Hammond High. She is now at PUC finishing a degree in engineering and working in the firm's office. Justin is the first student athlete at the University of Kentucky working on a degree in architecture- He cut classes his first year, but still received an A in the class.

Carrie is checking, but Bill thinks Hutton and Hutton is the oldest single family owned architectural firm in the nation ---115 years old.
