Speaker-Sarah Janiga, the club's representative to the "World Affairs Conference" was the speaker for the afternoon. She represented the Club two years in a row at the Conference. Sarah is a recent graduate of Hammond High School and will be attending Butler University this fall to study Pharmacy. The topic of the 32nd World Affairs Conference was World Hunger. There were over 30 countries represented at the event. She indicated that her group included students from Nigeria, China, Canada and the United States.

Two of the events she participated in involved demonstrating to the participants the impacts of hunger and the visual disparities between groups. The first activity consisted of the students being divided into groups which represented upper class, middle class and lower class. The upper income group which represented 15 %, sat at the table, the middle income group representing 50%, sat in a chair and the lower income group representing 35%, sat on the floor. According to their class structure, they were provided with the amount food they would receive for the day. The upper income group had a banquet set at the table, the middle income group received a bowl of rice and scoop of beans and the lower income group received just a bowl of rice. She described the emotional impact that this activity had on the participants. As the meal pro-

gressed and the students at the banquet table saw the distribution of the food, they began to share their food with the middle class and lower class students. The second event involved taking photos of who they lived with and the food that they ate. Sarah indicated how appreciative she was for the experience and how much an impact the experience had on her beliefs.

The mock simulation that was given to the group involved the students being the leaders of a nation which was having riots because there was a shortage of food. Each of the groups had to come up with a plan of how they were going to handle the riots. Some of the suggestions the groups came up with included subsidies for food and lower taxes.

Two critical issues discussed were Critical Media Literacy and Controlled Environmental Systems.

The media topic was important to her because she was able put together the purpose of media messages. The controlled environmental systems topic allowed her to explore how disease resistant plants can help in the fight against hunger.

Sarah will be returning as a counselor for the World Affairs Conference. She maintains contact with friends she meet from all over the world. Her network has expanded 3 times.
