There 10,000 diagnosed Alzheimer's patients in Lake County that can receive services provided by A.&D.S. Services include support groups for care givers, monthly information sessions, respite care and adult day care.

Alzheimer's is one of 50 separate dementia conditions, most are treatable. A neurologist works to determine whether a given problem is a treatable dementia. Alzheimer's is not treatable. Alois Alzheimer first described the disease in Bavaria in the late 1800's while working with mentally ill subjects. Autopsy after death confirmed the disease caused plaques and tangles in the brain. Alzheimer's is not a mental illness it is a disease. As it affects more and more of the brain, the subject appears to retrogress as memory fades away. The fading starts with the most recent memories and goes to the oldest memories over time.

There are certain red flags that could signal the onset of Alzheimer's. Losing the concept of numbers and not being able to balance a check book any longer. Forgetting how to use a microwave oven or a remote control for a TV. Victims also lose depth perception. Victims fall easily in bathrooms because they tend to have all white fixtures, black toilet seats help provide depth perception and make it safer for the victim.

The hippocampus portion of the brain processes memory in three stages, Input, Storage and Retrieval. Input is the first to go meaning that short term memory is lost first for Alzheimer's victims. Over time all memory is eventually lost.
