family life ministries. Additional services include Retired and Senior Volunteer Programs, Senior Companion Programs, and a Foster Grandparent Program. Duane shared that the Catholic Church's social teaching "is a rich treasure of wisdom about building a just society and living lives of holiness amidst the challenges of modern society". There are three key themes to the Catholic social tradition. We must first recognize that "human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society". Next, family and community must actively participate in our society. Finally, the Catholic tradition recognizes that "every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency".

Duane indicated that the Peace and Social Justice arm of the Catholic Church serves everyone regardless of background. They are committed to serving the needy. They look to solve problems that affect our society. This was an enlightening presentation and we wish Duane much success in his new position as Executive Director of Catholic Charities.
