Meeting Notes From JANUARY 15, 2008

Duane welcomed Milford Christenson as a Visiting Rotarian.

Also please keep the family of Joe Glotzbach in your thoughts and prayers. Joe was a pillar of the Hammond Rotary Club. He was a great example of a community leader.

Lisa Hein announced that Haven House will be celebrating their 25th Anniversary from 5pm – 7pm at Blue Café on Thursday. Lisa thanked Duane and Jeff for their support 10 ½ years ago. The agency was in neglect and they gave the agency a chance.

Mary Kaczka reminded the Club of the initial \$500 donation we gave for the Gift of Life program providing heart surgeries for children in India. The goal was to raise \$5000 in the District. If she did, the Foundation would match the donation. Each surgery costs \$2000. The goal was exceeded by raising \$6700 which will be matched by the Foundation. Some of the Rotary clubs that contributed were LaPorte, Elkhart, Schererville, Valparaiso and a few others. Mary thanked the Hammond club for taking the lead.

Hans Enderlin reminded everyone that the Directory is on the tables and we hope to complete them in about a month. Please be sure to check your information for accuracy. Hans thanked Jim McNabney for taking on the job of tracking our attendance.

Phyllis Mamula announced that her daughter, KJ, will be our guest speaker next week to discuss the Breast Cancer Walk she will be participating in.

Only one table of four got the trivia questions correct. There is \$162 in the pot with 42 cards remaining. Jim McNabney won the raffle and chose the Jack of Diamonds.

Duane thanked Lisa Hein for agreeing to be our impromptu guest speaker today. Haven House has come a long way over the last 25 years. Haven House is a family advocacy center that provides 24 hour temporary emergency shelter servicing domestic violence victims and their families. Haven House is located in Hammond but serves East Chicago, Whiting, Griffith, Highland, and Munster. The Transitional Housing Capital campaign helped to add capabilities for wheelchair bound women. This is almost always in use. She thanked the Hammond Rotarians for their support in this. The economy has had a big impact on the 2007 year. They had an additional 100 women and children. Currently the facility is a 20 bed facility.

Donations to Haven House are greatly appreciated and Lisa thanked the Rotarians for the donations they have made.

Haven House is teaching more life skills such as budgeting, nutrition, etc to help the women once they get permanent housing. They are looking to collaborate with the City of Hammond in an effort to help with domestic violence and assist with the criminal justice aspects of the women's situations. There are going to be cuts for the criminal justice support down the road.

Haven House received a \$10,000 grant to help with the Transitional Housing capital campaign. A portion of a stairway collapsed. A contribution from Horseshoe Casino assisted in purchasing the materials and they are looking to the building trades to assist with labor in kind assistance.

The average stay is between 30 and 45 days. The more educated women tend to stay between 7-14 days. Over 10 years ago, the average age of women that sought assistance were in their 20's, today, they are finding that these women are in their late 20's to 50's. There has been a large increase in the number of women and children coming from East Chicago. Reasons for this include better outreach and cultural diversity.

Haven House does not have a lot of women returning to the shelter Last year there was only one case, but this could be due to the other shelters in the area and the stigma that returning to the shelter that women can feel.

Lisa reminded everyone of the "Birthday party" on Thursday and if you can make it they would welcome "birthday gifts" such as paper goods, canned goods, gift certificates to stores, etc.

Bill Robinson said he would be unable to make it to the event, so he generously donated his "birthday gift" and suggested that, in memory of Joe Glotzbach, anyone that would be unable to attend to give their "birthday present" today. Lisa was very touched by the generosity of the Rotarians.
