Meeting Notes From JANUARY 26, 2010

She also informed the members that: 1) the Foundation has established a vehicle for Rotarians to donate to the Haiti relief effort; 2) applications are now available for anyone interested in a Rotary Peace Scholarship; and 3) applications are also available for any high school students interested in the District speech contest. Nancy Machnikowski also announced that Haven House is looking for a set of encyclopedias that is less than 10 years old.

Extractor Bassam Abdallah successfully stumped all 4 tables with questions about legal drinking ages around the world, and happy bucks were given by Lisa Woodruff who was glad to be back after a 3 week absence, Bill Robinson for his daughter Claire who is now studying in Paris, Hans Enderlin for his daughter's birthday, Diane Arias for the Bishop Noll students who surpassed their goal by raising 391 jars of peanut butter for the NWI Food Bank, and Duane Dedelow who was glad that the principal from his alma mater, Hammond High, had joined us for lunch.

Chuck Sanger then ran the raffle with Bassam Abdallah successfully answering the current events question. Bassam donated his \$10 prize to the water project, but then pulled the Queen of Diamonds instead of the Joker for a pot of \$234.

GSE Team Leader Linda Randolph then entertained the group with a wonderful presentation of some of the 3,000 slides she has amassed from the team's recent trip to South Korea. Linda and 4 young professionals (3 women and 1 man) were sent off

by DG Floyd Lancia with a good luck coin which Linda will pass on to the GSE team headed for Mexico later this year. Linda informed us that South Korea, which covers 233 square miles, is 600 years old, has 10.9 million people and also has one of the lowest birth rates in the world. She also provided info on its government, environment, religions and education. Linda proceeded to show us slides of her visits to the Koam Rotary Club (which has a waiting list of 70 people for membership), Leeum Museum, American Embassy, American Chamber of Commerce, National Assembly of South Korea, Coex Center, Seoul Ballet, diverse places of worship, International Zen Fair, Ferrari dealership, Samsung Comprehensive Cancer Center, a ceramics class, the DMZ, War Museum (which included a memorial to US service men), Dasan High School English Zone and Dankook University. Linda also explained how education is pushed to the extreme in South Korea where the suicide rate among young people is very high because of family pressure to do well. The GSE team also attended the District 3650 Conference where they met RI Past President DK Lee. Finally Linda showed us some of her extended trip to Tokyo where she visited the Rotary Club of Tokyo Hiroo, a Japanese wedding, a marketplace and the Canadian International School.

After the presentation, Mary Kaczka explained to the group that the GSE Program, which first began in the 1960s, is funded by the Foundation and attempts to foster world peace through cultural understanding. Mary also reminded us that the Hammond Club will be hosting the incoming team from South Korea during the week of April 10th.
