Judy Walker led the reciting of the "Four Way Test". Beth Jackson, Africa Talver, Phil Golden and Karen Clajewski and Lew Noe visited our Rotary meeting today.

Cal Bellamy announced that that on March 11, 2011 that there would be program on "Ethics in Government" at the Avalon. Chuck reminded the board members about the meeting after the Rotary presentation.

Bassam led the extractions and was assisted by Lisa. There were two extractions and one was for the water fund. Tom Donovan led the challenge question which was answered correctly by Diana.

Michelle Golden, introduced the speaker for the afternoon, Phil Taillon, Executive Director Planning and Development. Phil presented a power point presentation on the status of economic development projects in the City of Hammond; following is a brief summary of the 10 projects presented.

1. Lear Seating-this development is bringing back 200 employees to make seats for Ford.
2. Manards - is a 20 million dollar expansion. In addition it will bring back 200 employees and ad an additional 80 new jobs. There will be a grand opening on March 14, 2011 and everyone is invited.
3. RDA Development in Robertsdale- this project received 35 million dollar support from the RDA. The theatre has been completed and mainly used for August Fest. The City is now in the process of building walking trails. This recreational development

will work in conjunction with Horseshoe to have the ability to bring in other attractions.

4. River Park (Ox Bow Landing) – at this time the city is talking with developers or restaurants' and hotels. The property has been subdivided so that the land can be sold in individual lots and not as one development.
5. Wal-Mart in Robertsdale has 18 months to complete.
6. Lincoln Lake is a green housing development. There are 5 lots in the development and it has been financed with TIF Financing.
7. Pulaski Park will have a new recreational building which will include ice skating and other recreational activities.
8. Charter School- this is a project based learning curriculum and things seem to be going ok.
9. Downtown has received 6 new businesses including a 2.5 million dollar retail center that will include a night club, sports restaurant and cigarette bar.

Woodmar Mall there is a 12,000 sq. foot retail outlet going up at this time. Phil indicated that the developer has not released the name of the business because of the fear of the competition.
