Meeting Notes From March 30, 2010

Chuck Pintar then introduced the speaker for the afternoon, Terry Pintar who works the field of Fire Protection Engineering. Terry happens to be the son of Chuck and works for RJA. RJA has 16 offices in the United States. Terry specializes in the areas of Healthcare and high rise safety. As Terry said, his discussion was going to be an overview of fire protection 101. There are three schools in the United States that focuses in the area of Fire Protection Engineering. The discipline in the schools focuses in the following areas:

1. Human Services Analysis
2. Fire Protection Analysis
3. Fire Protection Design
4. Fire Protection and Management and
5. Building Construction.

Terry discussed the difference between building codes and building standards. Building codes are laws that indicate what you have to do. The building standard tells you how to implement the building codes. He reviewed the difficulties of providing fire safety to different types of buildings.

1. Assembly Facilities-because these are large open spaces they contain a lot of people
2. Corporate Real Estate Buildings- example of this would be the Hancock Building. The challenges presented here are compounded by

the fact that the buildings are so tall.

3. Educational Facilities-these have improved over the last five years.

In retrospect the fire protection in this category was better for jails than educational institutions.

4. Government facilities- examples are US Embassies and Court Houses.

5. Healthcare Facilities-this is Terry's speciality. This category is very crises driven. In order for hospitals to receive Medicare or Medicaid reimbursement they have to have the Joint Commission Status to approve the fire inspection of the institution. In relation to fire protection this category of buildings is very difficult to develop plans for and defend against fires because the occupants have to be defended in place.

6. High Rise Residential- this category is changing because when they were first built there were no requirements for fire protection systems.

7. Hospitality Facilities- these buildings present challenges, such as casinos and hotels, because they have transient and or overnight occupants.

Terry did present some personnel insights into his career. When he and his family, including his dad, were on vacation he booked the hotel room on a upper floor, and an unexpected fire broke out. Terry was not as concerned as the family because he knew that the stair ways had a two hour fire safety rating but he was surprised to see how fast his dad could move.

8. Industrial facilities-some present challenges such as Fed X because there are many conveyers and they obstruct the fire sprinkler systems. Never the less, they were able to receive approval of the plan because the material is in the facility for a very short period of time. However, this changed in the colder climates because in these areas the trucks are kept inside during cold weather.

Terry indicated that the field is constantly changing reaction to updates in technology. Right now suburban communities are using phone lines for fire alarm systems. In addition, there is constant negotiating with communities. Terry provided a very informative and timely discussion on the issue of fire safety for buildings.
