Today's Speaker: Ms. Amanda Maynard, Executive Director of the Challenger Learning Center. Ms. Maynard is a graduate of Ball State University with a B.S. degree and Purdue University with a Master's Degree. She has been a teacher in the Hobart schools: a NASA messenger, teaching other teachers about the mission to Mercury; and worked at the Adler Planetarium. The Challenger Learning Center (CLC) located on the campus of PUC is ten years old. It was established in memory of the Challenger space shuttle which crashed in 1986 with the teacher Krista McAuliffe aboard. The first CLC was located in Houston. There are 47 CLC in the U.S. and 3 internationally. The Hammond CLC has two simulators and is the only CLC with a planetarium. Since its opening in 1999 150,000 students and

teachers have participated in programs and simulated mission geared towards teaching communications, team work, and problem solving. CLC runs school programs which feature simulated space missions; a science lab which is named after Lisa Austygen, the former CLC executive director who passed away; e-missions which feature distance learning and video conferencing; Sky Voyages; the planetarium which features hands on activities; corporate missions for the business community; birthday parties; summer camp and family and community night which is open to the public in September and October.

CLC is not affiliated with PUC. They are funded by foundations and grants. Commonly, the CLC is confused with a program for the handicapped. CLC is awaiting approval of a federal earmark which will provide funds for badly need upgrades at the CLC.

Ms. Maynard noted that PU graduates the most engineers who go on to become astronauts, behind the Air Force Academy. However China has set a goal to reach to return to the moon in 2018 and the US in 2020. China is graduating more engineers and the US needs a way to maintain competitiveness.

CLC does not track students who have been through the CLC programs. They need a way to do that.
