Meeting Notes From MARCH 4, 2008

Dan Ryan is the District 6540 Foundation Chairman for the Rotary Foundation Annual campaign, he has set a goal of \$5,800 for our club. The goal is based on the number of members times \$100.

We sang Happy Birthday to our March babies.

The winning raffle number was 1797 held by Chuck Pintar, he drew the Four of Hearts.

Tom Keilman from BP was our speaker. Tom is a native of Hammond. He attended Our Lady of Perpetual Help for elementary school and Morton High School, both located in Hessville.

Tom was at the meeting to discuss the \$3.8 billion investment that BP has planned in upgrades to their Whiting refinery. The upgrades will transform the plant from processing mostly Texas and Gulf crude oil to mostly Alberta Canada oil sands mined near Fort McMurray Alberta.

The construction of the Whiting refinery began in 1888, and production commenced in 1889.

Currently the plant produces 60 millions of fuel per day. 16 % of production is gasoline, 20% is diesel fuel ,and 26% jet

fuel. The refinery is a pipeline operation with virtually all raw materials and finished product arriving and leaving via pipeline.

The plant upgrade will accomplish several goals. It will provide energy security for the Midwest, and assure the long term viability of the Whiting plant, as well as allow the plant to refine a fuel stock that is readily available on this continent. Alberta Canada has oil reserves second to only to Saudi Arabia, the estimated reserves are 174 billion barrels of oil equivalent.

BP will invest \$3.8 billion in the following manner:

\$1.4 billion for plant environmental equipment

\$1.7 billion to expand capacity of the plant

\$1.1 billion will be spent in East Chicago, \$140 million in Hammond, \$70 million in Whiting,

\$150 million in waste water treatment enhancements.

Tom has several point to make about the planned waste water treatment in direct contradiction to the assertions made erroneously by the Chicago Tribune. There will be no sludge discharged by the waste water treatment plant. There is no bypassing allowed in the plants waste water permit Ever, not the case with virtually every municipal waste water treatment plant in the United States.

The plant has steadily decreased its emissions with total emissions decreasing from 27,000 tons in 2001 to 12,000 tons in 2006. The planned plant upgrades will lower current emission levels while increasing production by 17%.

The plant water permit is in place. Construction can not begin until the air permit is approved. The current schedule calls for BP to authorize the construction in the 3rd quarter of 2008 once the air permit is granted by the EPA.
