### Honor Scholars' Luncheon

Nancy Machnikowski introduced the guests joining the group from Hammond Schools.

Mrs. Theresa Mayerik, Morton High School, chose the speaker for today. She said she chose Mrs. Shelley Crosby because she went to school in Hammond and has a successful life to share. Mrs. Mayerik encouraged all students to come back someday and share their successes as the guest speaker. Mrs. Crosby was born in Hessville, went to Harding and Morton and graduated from Morton H.S. in 1975. She has been a professional actress for 21 years.

Shelley Crosby is the Artistic Director of American Girl Place Theater in Chicago. They employ over 50 children ages 9 – 16 performing in a 1 hour and 15 minute musical show. The shows are core stories of the American Girl Brand, portraying historical characters that were originally developed in stories. American Girl was founded as a literary company. Its founder realized that Barbie was the "role model" for young girls and decided to develop stories based on other characters that would be better viewed as role models. As it became more successful, people asked for the dolls associated with the books. After a successful catalog company, they developed the "retail experience". Gretchen Cryer suggested that they build a theater in the Chicago location and that's where the theater started.

After high school, Shelley took all opportunities as learning opportunities, which she encourages these students to do as well. She married and had children at a young age, but she also made choices to be involved in
